Ask your child what it was that you tapped.</li> <li>Listen to the story, 'We're going on a bear hunt'. Encourage your child to make the sounds.</li> </ul>

Outdoor Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Collect outdoor items and put them in a box or bag. Encourage your child to describe how the item feels without looking in the bag.</li> <li>Encourage your child to help you hang the washing. Model describing the items as you hang them on the line, encouraging your child to do the same.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you care for everyone and everything?</li> <li>Can you show respect and good manners at all times?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you make a handwashing poster, drawing pictures to show the people in your family how to wash their hands?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Listen to an audio book outside.</li> <li>Gather materials to create a small world model.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>How many patterned items can you find outside in 2 minutes?</li> <li>Can you create your own patterns using natural materials such as stones?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Have a go at plane spotting. Tell your family where you think that plane is going?</li> <li>When you are walking past restaurants, discuss what cuisine it is and the food they might do.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you collect natural materials and put them in order of roughest to smoothest?</li> <li>Experiment with different ways of joining. Could you tie or stick pieces together?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Play grandma's footsteps.</li> <li>Go on a listening walk, draw a picture of the things you can hear.</li> <li>Play I can hear instead of I spy in the garden.</li> </ul>
