Listen to music and draw quickly and slowly based on the tempo of the music.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Look at the RWI formation link. Can you find the rhymes for the letters of your name?</li> <li>Can you write the letters of your name, saying the rhymes for each letter?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Discuss the number three.</li> <li>Can you correctly form the numbers 1,2 and 3?</li> <li>Go on a number hunt. Hide numbers around the house and encourage your child to correctly identify them.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you help water the plants in the house?</li> <li>Discuss with your child how to care for plants and why it is important.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Draw or paint a picture that gives you happiness.</li> <li>Showcase your creation to your family and explain why it shows happiness etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>An alternative to dancing to music is to let our tongues dance.</li> <li>Use a mirror to watch your faces as you make funny noises and words e.g. 'blobalobalob' 'brrrrr' 'mamamama' 'shhhh'.</li> </ul>
