








Dear Grown-ups, please use this to help you with home learning. You can use this as a way to discuss the things we are learning in school.

Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you do a staring contest with your family? See who can set a record. Challenge your child to see who smiles, blinks or laughs first. Why not make up your own rules? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Play a board game such as Jenga. Encourage your child to find solutions to stop the tower falling down. Discuss ideas to support your child to solve conflicts. Do a breathing exercise together: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gLbK0o9Bk7Q&safe=active 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to your favourite music and work as a team to come up with movements. Challenge your child to remember the sequence. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Go on a print hunt around the house. Look at the different prints such as, newspapers and non-fiction books. Discuss what the differences are between the prints and the importance of them. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can you correctly form the numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 independently? Watch Number Blocks video 5. Go on a number hunt around the house. Encourage your child to correctly identify the numbers you have asked them to find. Challenge your child to match numeral and quantity correctly. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are learning about places of worship this week, including the people who work there. We will be focusing on churches and synagogues. Show your child pictures of the places of worship and see if you can spot any whilst walking to and from school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Have a go at learning the songs from Rapunzel the Lockdown Pantomime.
