











Dear Grown-ups, please use this to help you with home learning. You can use this as a way to discuss the things we are learning in school.

Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can I learn new dinosaur vocabulary this week?</li> <li>See if you can identify the names of some dinosaurs.</li> <li>Here is a dinosaur names video you can watch: <a href="https://watchkin.com/a3ef995573">https://watchkin.com/a3ef995573</a></li> <li>Links to Literacy learning objective.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can I manage my own needs independently? Such as handwashing.</li> <li>Have a go at following this handwashing guide: <a href="https://watchkin.com/d3af868bf4">https://watchkin.com/d3af868bf4</a></li> <li>Can you have a go at brushing a dinosaur's teeth. You could use the dinosaur figures you have at home, alternatively you can draw one.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you do this 'Dinosaur Stomp' dance? <a href="https://watchkin.com/f982e45709">https://watchkin.com/f982e45709</a></li> <li>Now have a go at creating your own dinosaur dance.</li> <li>Think about the type of music you would like to use.</li> </ul> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can you write the initial sounds to label a dinosaur?</li> <li>Use new vocabulary to label parts of a dinosaur such as, horns, claws, frill.</li> </ul> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can I compare lengths or weight?</li> <li>Make sure to use correct vocabulary when describing objects relating to size such as, heavy and light, long and short.</li> <li>Can I compare objects by using pieces of Lego to measure the length of objects?</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Can I recognise the differences and similarities?</li> <li>Talk about the changing seasons and what we can notice when a new season comes along.</li> <li>Go on a Spring hunt and see if you can notice signs of the new season such as, snow drops.</li> </ul> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask your grown up to be the conductor of different music. You could use a radio to carry out this activity.</li> <li>Create your dinosaur dance by listening to the music. If it is soft music you might be a slow dinosaur, if the music changes to a quick tempo you might be a quick dinosaur.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>A phoneme is the smallest unit of sound</b> that distinguishes one word from another word in a language.</li> <li>See the pure sound pronunciation link at the bottom of the page to ensure you are saying the correct sound name.</li> <li><b>Farm animal game.</b> Choose some animals with three-phoneme names and hide them in a bag. Sing, 'Old Mac Donald' and then sound talk the animals for your child to blend the sounds to make words.</li> <li><b>Here are some three-phoneme animal names:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- P-i-g</li> <li>- D-u-ck</li> <li>- C-ow (2 phoneme)</li> <li>- D-o-g</li> <li>- Sh-ee-p</li> <li>- G-oo-t</li> <li>- C-a-t</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>This activity will also be modelled on Class Dojo if you would like to see it before carrying the activity out at home.</p>
